Fee structure: The service is subsidised by the Wimbledon Guild to ensure that even clients who can only contribute minimally to the cost can still receive quality counselling. Contributions are, therefore negotiated with clients on an individual basis. Client's incomes are taken into account. There is a non-refundable booking fee for the first consultation, and there is no free service. The majority of counselling at WGCS is one to one but they also provide: Family work, Group therapy, Counselling for young people, Continuing Professional Training for counsellors and an Eating Disorders Group.
